## **The ENTER 2000, VCE Studies and VET**

\* Where a VCE VET 3 and 4 sequence study is un-scored, it should not automatically be deemed acceptable as meeting the stated prerequisites but be considered on an individual basis.

## 2000 Scaling Report.

The Board of Studies provides VTAC with study scores (relative positions). These study scores are scaled in order to calculate scaled aggregates and Equivalent National Tertiary Entrance Ranks (ENTERs). Candidates are in the 2000 scaling population if they have obtained a Board of Studies' study score in English/English (ESL) plus at least three other Board of Studies' study scores in 1999 and 2000, provided that at most one result is from 1999. The scaling population is therefore a subset of the entire population. The means and standard deviations below pertain to the scaling population in 2000.

The following table gives the 2000 scaled means and standard deviations as well as the scaled scores (rounded to the nearest integer) corresponding to the Board of Studies study scores of 20, 25, 30, 35, 40, 45 and 50. The formal aggregation process uses scaled scores to two decimal places, but the following information gives a good indication of how scaling adjusts scores in the various studies.

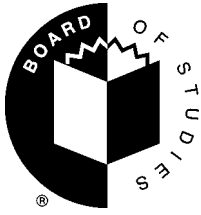
NOTES:

1. A number of studies were not scaled by the automatic procedure, since their eligible scaling population was less than or equal to eleven. These studies are annotated, as small study not scaled automatically. The means and standard deviation are not given in these cases, since they are not particularly informative.
2. The scaled mean for the small LOTEs has been increased by five. As a guide only: for small LOTEs (small studies not scaled automatically that are also LOTEs), estimate the scaled study score by adding 5 to the study score.
3. Three LOTEs, Australian Indigenous, Estonian and Latvian had no completing students at level 3/4 in 2000.

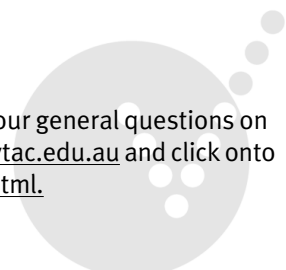
