VTAC your one stop shop for courses, scholarships and special consideration

VTAC administers three applications: VTAC course application, VTAC scholarship application and Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS) application. VTAC also takes bookings for admissions tests. A range of courses are also listed for which the applicant may apply directly to the institution.

Courses through VTAC

You can apply for courses through VTAC if you are:

- an Australian citizen
- an Australian permanent resident
- a New Zealand citizen
- a temporary resident currently studying an Australian Year 12* or International Baccalaureate in Australia or New Zealand. *For example: VCE, VCAL, HSC, NTCE, QLD Senior Certificate, SACE, TCE, WACE.
- an international student currently enrolled at The University of Melbourne applying to transfer to another course at The University of Melbourne.

If you don't meet the citizenship/residency requirements above you must apply directly to institutions—not through VTAC.

There are three levels of requirements you must meet to be considered for a course:

- tertiary entrance requirements
- institutional entrance requirements
- course application requirements

If you don't meet tertiary entrance requirements or have had difficulty meeting them or have not studied for the past few years, you should consider applying for special consideration such as Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS) or pathways and preparatory programs. The Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS) application associated with Semester 1, 2013 closes 5.00 pm on 9 October 2012. SEAS applications for Semester 2, 2013 close on 7 June 2013.

See a demonstration

You can view a demonstration before you start your real course application. The 'demo' works just like the real thing, but you won't be able to save or submit anything you type into the demo. See Course application demo on the VTAC website (www.vtac.edu.au/demos/app/).

Courses via direct application

A number of private Regional Training Organisations list their courses with VTAC, but manage their own application and offer processes. Applicants to these courses can link directly to the institutional website from VTAC CourseSearch available at www.vtac.edu.au/courses/searchfield.html

Similarly a number of traditional VTAC institutions that offer their undergraduate courses through the VTAC process have also listed a number of post graduate courses for which graduates can apply directly to the institution. Applicants to these courses can link directly to the institutional website from VTAC CourseSearch available at www.vtac.edu.au/courses/searchfield.html

Special consideration

Many institutions offer a range of alternative entry schemes that take into account short and long-term disadvantage. While many are offered through the single VTAC SEAS application process, others require you to apply directly to the institution. All applicants should read the information to find out whether or not they are eligible to apply through SEAS or via one of the direct institutional schemes.

Special entry access scheme (SEAS) through VTAC

To access the SEAS application, applicants must:

- Register with VTAC and create their VTAC user account and
- Submit a course application – SEAS only becomes available after the course application has been submitted.
- No course application, no SEAS.

There are six categories within SEAS. Not all institutions recognise all categories:

- Category 1: Personal information and location which includes:
 - » Age—will generally be used by institutions that recognise and operate mature age entry schemes
 - » Gender—to identify if you are applying for a course in a male or female under-represented discipline
 - » Living or school postcode—to identify applicants from a regional or remote area or applicants who will need to move to undertake tertiary study
 - » Recognition as an Indigenous Australian
 - » Under-represented school—to identify if you attend one of various under-represented schools identified by institutions under this category—also refer to Category 6 if you are applying to La Trobe University, University of Ballarat or Victoria University.
- Category 2: Non-English speaking background
- Category 3: Difficult circumstances
- Category 4: Disadvantaged financial background
- Category 5: Disability or medical condition
- Category 6: La Trobe University SALT, University of Ballarat REEP, Victoria University PPP

The Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS) application associated with Semester 1, 2013 opens on 6 August 2012 at 9.00am and closes at 5.00pm on 9 October 2012. SEAS applications for Semester 2, 2013 close on 7 June 2013.

Scholarships

Most institutions listed in the VTAC Guide have a number of scholarships available to applicants to reward academic excellence and ensure equitable access to education. For some of these scholarships you will need to apply directly to the institution via their own website. For all other scholarships you should use the VTAC Scholarships Application available at www.vtac.edu.au

Scholarships through VTAC

Institutional Access and Equity Scholarships

Victorian universities provide their own scholarships to assist students both through VTAC and directly. Scholarships determined via the VTAC scholarships application may be awarded to students with financial difficulties, Indigenous Australians and other equity and access groups as defined by each institution.

Commonwealth Scholarships

There are three types of Commonwealth scholarships:

The Student Start-Up and Relocation Scholarships are available to students receiving income support and will be administered by Centrelink.

The Indigenous Commonwealth Scholarships are administered by institutions and will be allocated to students who meet the Commonwealth eligibility as described on the Centrelink website and have had their Indigenous status confirmed.

Merit scholarships

2013 Merit scholarships may be awarded to students for academic achievement if they have studied an Australian Year 12 or the International Baccalaureate (IB) in 2012. To be considered, applicants must apply for courses through VTAC and do not need to lodge a VTAC Scholarship Application. Where an institution offers merit scholarships, students who have listed that institution on their course preference list and met any additional course or institutional eligibility will automatically be assessed by that institution.

Accessing VTAC information through social media

The VTAC social media include three public platforms and one private platform.

Public platforms

The following three types of media are available to anyone who is interested in subscribing:

- The VTAC blog
- Facebook
- Twitter

All information posted on the public blog is automatically posted on Twitter and Facebook, so you only need to pick one platform and subscribe.

Last year while all information was posted on the blog, most users preferred to access this information via Facebook and the following samples indicate the overall success:

- Getting the best out of your Extra requirements – 12,700 reads
- What not to do when you attend an interview for a course preference – 24,000 reads
- Detailed explanations and information on applying for SEAS – 18,750 reads.
- Webinars for The ATAR and results and Change of preferences – 440, participants
- Weekly course amendments – 6-7,000 reads (per week).

Careers practitioners platform

The careers practitioner's blog is where we include targeted information about factors affecting your students and clients. Like the public blogs, this is an interactive platform that relies on feedback, ideas and suggestions from the careers fraternity.

Prerequisites clarification on two-year rule

Current Rules – 2012/13 Selection

The current rules associated with changes to prerequisites by institutions are:

1. Prerequisites must be satisfied at the stated level published in the VTAC Guide before an offer can be made except where:
 - a The required knowledge has otherwise been achieved through other qualifications.
 - b Consideration under Special Entry Access Schemes (SEAS) or other special entry scheme has been applied.
2. Prerequisite study specifications and changes to them must be advised to schools two years in advance of the date of students making their applications, i.e. when students are in year 10 and about to make their choices for years 11 and 12.

Exceptions to the above

- The following changes can be made in the VTAC Guide for the current selection year:
- Changes to minimum study scores for prerequisite studies
- Addition of prerequisite subjects as alternatives to those already published.

Example 1: Changes to minimum study scores for prerequisite studies

- From: Course A (prerequisites published in VICTER 2014)
A study score of at least 25 in each of English (any) and chemistry
- To: Course A (prerequisites published in VTAC Guide 2014)
A study score of at least 30 in English (ESL) and a study score of at least 25 in any other English and a study score of at least 20 in chemistry.

Example 2: Addition of prerequisite subjects as alternatives to those already published.

- From Course B (prerequisites published in VICTER 2014)
A study score of at least 30 in English (ESL) and a study score of at least 25 in any other English and a study score of at least 20 in chemistry and mathematical methods (CAS).

- To Course B (prerequisites published in VTAC Guide 2014)
A study score of at least 30 in English (ESL) and a study score of at least 25 in any other English and a study score of at least 20 in chemistry and mathematics (any).

Changes to come into effect for 2013/14

In June 2012 the VTAC Management Committee endorsed a proposal to relax the two year rule for prerequisites. From next year:

- Prerequisites may be removed from the VTAC Guide for the current selection year.
- Subjects removed must be added to the course middle-band statement and an explicitly stated aggregate bonus points awarded for the removed subjects.

Example 3:

- **From Course C (prerequisites published in VICTER 2014)**
A study score of at least 30 in English (ESL) or a study score of at least 25 in any other English and a study score of at least 20 in two of physics, Information technology (any) and chemistry.
- **To Course C (prerequisites published in VTAC Guide 2014)**
There are no prerequisite studies.

The middle band statement will include a statement similar to:

*... a study score of at least ** in English (ESL) or ** in any other English = an aggregate of # points higher. A study score of at least ** in physics, information technology (any) or chemistry = an aggregate of # points higher per study*

Example 4:

- **From Course D (prerequisites published in VICTER 2014)**
A study score of at least 30 in English (any) and a study score of at least 20 in chemistry and mathematical methods (CAS).
- **To Course D (prerequisites published in VTAC Guide 2014)**
A study score of at least 30 in English (any) and a study score of at least 20 in mathematical methods (CAS).

The middle band statement will include a statement similar to:

*... a study score of at least ** in Chemistry = an aggregate of # points higher.*

This means that from 2013/14, a course may be published in VICTER as having prerequisites and appear in the Guide with none or with one of the previously stated prerequisites removed. Should this occur, then the institution must include the group of studies they have removed in their middle-band statements.

VTAC publications

VTAC has produced a series of publications to assist year 10 student's plan their future year 12 programs and year 12 students prepare for applying for courses and associated schemes.

The VTAC Guide 2013

The VTAC Guide 2013 has undergone a transformation for 2013.

The book is now published annually and includes dates, fees and times for applications and offers for the early, main and mid-year application periods in 2012 and 2013.

Also new to the VTAC Guide is the inclusion of:

- a Special consideration – Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS) chapter
- a Scholarships chapter
- institutions and courses that require applicants to apply directly to the institution and not through VTAC
- post graduate courses via direct applications
- institutional links to policy statements on Enrolment, Deferment, Credit transfer, Recognition of prior learning and Pathways
- Quick links to institutional services such as Accommodation; special consideration not part of SEAS and Scholarships not part of the VTAC scholarships process.
