



Appointment of New VTAC Director

Ms Elaine Wenn has been appointed Director of the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC), the body which operates the joint selection system for entry to Victoria’s tertiary institutions.

Ms Wenn was the General Manager–Assessment, with the Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority (VCAA), where she was responsible for the Victorian Year 12 assessment and certification program.

Chairman of the VTAC Board, Mr Ian Marshman– Senior Vice-Principal of the University of Melbourne, said, Ms Wenn brings considerable experience in high-level education administration and, in her VCAA role, she has been able to observe VTAC, ‘from the other side of the fence’.

Ms Wenn succeeds Mr John Wade, who retired on 25 August, 2006 after 31 very successful years as the head of VTAC.

Change to permissible mathematics study in ENTER Primary Four

As advised in the VCAA BULLETIN-VCE, VCAL and VET, JULY 2006 (page 5):

“...from 2007 there will be no restriction on the number of Mathematics units that can be counted as credit towards the VCE, other than those related to Mathematical Methods and Mathematical Methods (CAS)

Therefore a student could, from 2007, obtain credit for a maximum of twelve mathematics units towards the VCE. Mathematical Methods Units 1-4 and Mathematical Methods (CAS) Units 1-4 continue to be deemed equivalent studies.

This change does not affect the advice published in the VCE Mathematics Study Design with respect to the relationship between the studies in terms of study structure and assumed knowledge and skills.

The VCAA has advised the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC) of the change in credit arrangements for 2007. VTAC will advise schools of any decision to vary the current advice with respect to the restrictions on Mathematics units for the purposes of the calculation of the Equivalent National Tertiary Entrance Rank (ENTER)...”

VTAC advises that given the above advice, from 2007 the restriction that only one of Further Mathematics and Specialist Mathematics can be used in the Primary Four (the other can be used as an increment) will be lifted. Thus from the 2007 ENTER calculation the mathematics restriction will be limited to the breadth restriction: - in

the study area of mathematics at most two results can contribute to the Primary Four,

at most three results can contribute to the ENTER, be they VCE results or Extension study results.

Extension studies update

Extension Studies is a program designed for high achieving VCE students.

For a university study to be included in the Extension Studies Program it has to be deemed to be an extension of a VCE study. In most cases this VCE study (units 3 and 4) is known as the preparatory study and the student has to either have satisfactorily completed this study or be enrolled in the preparatory study concurrently with the extension study. In addition, some university studies have other prerequisite requirements which the student must meet.

Schools wishing to participate in the Extension Studies Program have the responsibility of ascertaining from the university the prerequisite and preparatory study requirements required for a student enrolling in an extension study.

A student who withdraws from or fails to satisfactorily complete the prerequisite or preparatory study will not be eligible for an extension study increment in their ENTER calculation regardless of their performance in the university study.

Middle-band: A study score of at least 35 in any of Classical Societies and Cultures, English (any), Geography, History (any), International Politics, LOTE (any), Philosophy, Psychology, Religion and Society, Sociology, Texts and Traditions = an aggregate 1 point higher per study to a maximum of 4 points. Consideration will also be given to Access Melbourne applicants.

Bioscience (New Generation) - Parkville

Prerequisites: Units 3 and 4-a study score of at least 25 in English (any), at least 35 in Chemistry, and at least 25 in one of Mathematics Methods (either), Specialist Mathematics, Biology or Physics.

Selection mode: CY12: ENTER and two-stage process with a middle-band of approximately 20%. NONY12: Entire academic record including GPA.

Middle-band: Consideration will be given to Access Melbourne applicants.

Commerce (New Generation) – Parkville

Prerequisites: Units 3 and 4-a study score of at least 25 in each of English (any) and Mathematical Methods (either).

Selection mode: CY12: ENTER and two-stage process with a middle-band of approximately 20%. NONY12: Entire academic record including GPA.

Middle-band: Consideration will be given to Access Melbourne applicants.

Environments (New Generation) – Parkville

Prerequisites: Units 3 and 4-a study score of at least 25 in English (any).

Note: For students intending to major in architecture, property and construction or an engineering discipline, knowledge equivalent to VCE Units 3 and 4 Mathematical Methods (either) will be assumed. Students without this knowledge will have to undertake bridging studies.

Selection mode: CY12: ENTER and two-stage process with a middle-band of approximately 20%. NONY12: Entire academic record including GPA.

Middle-band: Consideration will be given to Access Melbourne applicants.

Music (New Generation) – Parkville

Prerequisites: Units 3 and 4- a study score of at least 25 in English (any).

Selection mode: CY12: ENTER, audition and musicianship test.

NONY12: Entire academic record including GPA, audition and musicianship test.

Science (New Generation) – Parkville

Prerequisites: Units 3 and 4-a study score of at least 25 in English (any), Mathematical Methods (either) and in one of Biology, Chemistry or Physics.

Selection mode: CY12: ENTER and two-stage process with a middle-band of approximately 20%. NONY12: Entire academic record including GPA.

Middle-band: A study score of at least 25 in two of Biology, Physics, Chemistry or an additional mathematics = an aggregate 1 point higher to a maximum of 1 point. Consideration will also be given to Access Melbourne applicants.

Engineering – Parkville

Prerequisites: Units 3 and 4-a study score of at least 25 in English (any) and of at least 32 in Mathematical Methods (either).

Selection mode: CY12: ENTER and two-stage process with a middle-band of approximately 20%. NONY12: Entire academic record including GPA.

Middle-band: A study score of at least 25 in any of Chemistry, Physics or Specialist Mathematics = an aggregate 1 point higher per study to a maximum of 3 points. Consideration will also be given to Access Melbourne applicants.

Special Entry Access Schemes (SEAS)- In brief

SEAS is an umbrella program for all special entry schemes conducted by tertiary institutions participating in the VTAC system. There are two distinct schemes:

1. Access and Equity incorporating ALL scholarships for Deakin University, Monash University and the University of Melbourne.
2. Year 12 Special Consideration

Access and Equity

Access and equity schemes are targeted at applicants who have been unable to reach their full educational potential or who may have access to the courses of their choice restricted because of their life-circumstances. In addition to scholarships at Deakin University, Monash University and the University of Melbourne, there are 10 categories:

- Mature Age Entry
- Non-English speaking background
- Recognition as an Indigenous Australian
- Difficult family circumstances
- Disadvantaged socio-economic background
- Rural or isolated applicants
- Under-represented schools:
 - Deakin University (Deakin Access and Equity Programme)
 - Monash University (Monash Aptitude Test Entry Scheme - MATES)
 - The University of Melbourne
- RMIT Schools network Access program (SNAP)
- Women in non-traditional courses
- Disability or long term medical condition
- All scholarships at Deakin University, Monash University and the University of Melbourne

Year 12 Special Consideration

Year 12 Special Consideration is aimed at assist those current year 12 students who have experienced circumstances that can be demonstrated to have had an adverse impact on their performance in the **final year** of secondary schooling.

Eligibility

Anyone considering applying for either Access and Equity or Year 12 Special Consideration must confirm their eligibility. All eligibility requirements are outlined in the booklet *SEAS - Special Entry Access Schemes*.

In addition to confirming the general eligibility requirements, applicants must also confirm institutional requirements outlined under for each category,

Evidence

A number of categories and institutions require applicants to provide evidence to support their SEAS claim. To successfully finalise the SEAS application process, this documentation **must** be submitted by 5pm Friday 6 October, 2006.

VTAC recommends that schools configure their firewalls to temporarily allow access for the old and new VTAC IP addresses following the transfer. A fortnight should be sufficient. The old IP addresses can be removed after this time.
