## 1. VTAC Privacy Policy

### **AMENDMENT: POLICIES AND PROCEDURES FOR THE RELEASE OF YEAR 12 STUDENT INFORMATION TO SECONDARY SCHOOLS AND YEAR 12 PROVIDERS**

As you will be aware each year a number of schools use ENTER and/or Offer data to promote or market their school's success through media outlets. In sending this data to schools it was never the intention of the VTAC Management Committee that it's data be used for this purpose.

As you will be aware, with the introduction of the National Privacy Policy, VTAC has developed a series of conditions under which data is now released to schools.

As part of this Agreement and in an effort to restrict this misuse of VTAC data, schools were advised that they could not use the data for any other reason than the purpose of counselling and information (aggregated) purposes.

What VTAC was unaware of, was the effect this Agreement would have on how schools determine their DUX or in the presentation of school based awards. In an effort to assist schools in this process and following legal advice, VTAC advises you of the following amendment to the Agreement.

#### **CONDITIONS OF RELEASE OF DATA**

Clause 2.3 should now read:

'In particular the early release of the VCE ENTER file and standard release of the Offer file is made available to the Principal (or their nominee(s) i.e. careers teacher), for the strict purpose of identifying students that may be at risk or require course counselling.

However, with prior written consent of a student(s) this information may be used:

- a) as part of the determination of school based awards;
- b) to advise other teachers (as consented to) of a student(s) ENTER and offer;

The information may not be used to contact a student(s):

- c) to seek their permission to use the data for external marketing or promotional purposes; or
- d) any other reason, other than the primary reason it was released to the school.

## 2. International Students and changes to their status

Please note that any change to a student's status ie. from local to international or visa versa; will now incur an administrative fee of \$33 per student.
