Lost Logins/Passwords

If you or your school has lost the VTAC CourseLink login or password you must undertake the following procedures:

- ▶ Write or fax your request on school letterhead to David Osborne, Manager Schools Liaison, on fax (03) 9686 6054. Please do not telephone or Email your requests.
- ▶ State your name, position and request. There will be a maximum 48-hour turnaround on these requests.
- ▶ Include name and signature of principal.
- ▶ Should you require your password any earlier, an \$11.00 fee will be charged and invoiced at a later date. This request must be included in your fax/letter.

Note: Passwords and/or login names will not be issued over the telephone or via Email.

Accessing CourseLink

The number of schools making full use of CourseLink has been overwhelming. To further assist you VTAC has revised the program to allow schools to download and print all student names and preferences – one per page.

The following steps will assist you in this process:

Netscape/Internet Explorer

Click on Student Report.

Click on Student Preferences.

Click the **INFO** button next to “Download all preferences printable text files” – it will tell you “Save this file to your local hard drive and open in WordPad to print.

Note: The report is best printed with font COURIER NEW, size 8 and LANDSCAPE orientation”. Press **OK**.

Click on “**Download** all preferences printable text files”: A dialog box will open saying – Opening allprefs— using Notepad (allprefs— means school number) and give you the option to open the file or save it to disk.

Set the “Open it” option – Click **OK** – It may tell you it is too big for Notepad. “**Would you like to use WordPad to read this file?**”. Answer “Yes”.

Press **Ctrl+A** to highlight all your students.

Choose **Format** → **Font...** – Set size to **8**. Click **OK**.

Choose **File** → **Print...**

In the Print dialog box – Click “Properties...” and set paper size to Landscape – Click **OK** – Then Click **OK** to print.
